My beloved spoke and said to me "Arise, my darling, my beautiful one, come with me. See! The winter is past; the rains are over and gone. Flowers appear on the earth; the season of singing has come." ~ Song of Solomon 2:10-12a

New England spring is always a little shy, like someone peeking out their crackedopen door and then withdrawing quickly inside before they're spotted. One day it's 70 and sunny, the next we are shoveling snow. Most years, I'm not confident that spring has truly arrived until Memorial Day.

But this year, after a long and lonely winter, I'm more than willing to trade on hope. With the melting of winter's snow, I'm ready to tolerate whatever a New England spring might throw at us to return to weekly in-person worship, beginning Sunday, April 18, at 11 a.m. We will also continue to offer a joint online service of Morning Prayer with St. Mark's via Facebook and YouTube.

As much as we would like, the pandemic is not fully behind us, so we will continue to worship outside for the foreseeable future. As per instructions from our bishops and public health experts, we will continue to wear facemasks and remain 6 feet apart, and we will have to settle for spiritual food instead of sweet treats at coffee hour. But I am confident the sweetness of seeing one another again will be enough to make our weekly gatherings something to look forward to.

Please also note the new time for the start of worship: 11 a.m. We anticipate this will be a permanent shift; St. Mark's is shifting their service time to 9 a.m. so there is enough time between services for me to make my way from one church to the other. In the near future, we also anticipate adding a 10 a.m. fellowship and Christian Education hour before worship. This will give us ongoing opportunities for children's Sunday School classes, lay-led Bible studies and book clubs, relaxed fellowship time to chat and catch up with one another, and as COVID restrictions relax further, perhaps even the occasional brunch!

Because I will be leaving St. Mark's with just enough time to make it to Trinity for 11 a.m. worship, we will need some volunteers to help worship run smoothly. This "master of ceremonies" will be responsible for making sure everything is ready for worship: the Altar Guild has had time to set the table, the assigned lector and chalice bearer are present and ready to fill their roles, bulletins are available, and visitors have been welcomed. It will be this person's role to encourage people to move from fellowship time to the church for worship, and even, if necessary, to ask the lector to begin the Liturgy of the Word if I am unexpectedly delayed. This is an ideal role for someone with a knack for organization and a friendly way with people, and I know we have many people at Trinity who are perfect for it! If you would be willing to take a turn, please give me a call or drop me a text at 508-472-9656 or an e-mail revsuzannewade@gmail.com. I'd also like to hear from anyone who is willing to return to familiar roles as lector, intercessor, or chalice bearer, or who would be interested in trying such a role.

I look forward to seeing many of you on Easter Sunday at 1 p.m., and then on Sundays beginning April 18 at 11 a.m.!

<u>Seafarer's Friends</u> We are collecting and creating hats and scarves.


<u>Loaves & Fishes—Devens</u> — We are still collecting hardy canned soups and pasta meals.

Minutes from Rectory Renovation Gang Meeting, Friday, March 26, 2021



Present at the meeting were: Nancy Shepherd; Meredith Marcinkewicz; Karla Leonard; Jean Reed; Nan Gulliver; Chet Hooper and Stephanie Hooper, Junior Warden

In this meeting, we reviewed the progress of the rectory repairs, which we had discussed at our last meeting, March 12.

- The electrical outlets are now all grounded and a new outlet has been put in the pantry off the kitchen. The bill for the work of the electrician, Mitchell Tine, has been paid.
- Darwin Farjardo has agreed to repair the stone steps and walkway in the front of the rectory as well as the steps at the front door. He will make a peastone walkway leading to the stone steps at both doors and edge the walkway with cobblestone. The railings at both steps will be included in the price of \$7,000.00. The Historical Commission of Shirley will review this plan at their next meeting.
- -(P.S. The Commission met a few days later and approved Darwin's plan for the walkway and the steps. They also approved Fred Shoemaker's plan for the gutter over the porch and the down spout to divert the water away from the house. Darwin will find a time within the next month when he can do this work.)
- We have not heard anything new from Mass Save.
- Chet is in touch with the alarm company, SimpliSafe, to purchase two more smoke detectors at a reasonable cost.
- Stephanie contacted Guthrie Brothers to ask how much it would cost to put more large stones in the rectory driveway and in the parking lot next to the church to help reduce the large areas of mud. Guthrie will investigate the situation and give us an estimate, soon.
- We mentioned that we had heard that Bret Bahe had installed proper bulbs in all the light fixtures in the Chapel.
- Stephanie mentioned that she was going to contact Paul Swider, a window restorer, to ask if he could work with Bret to fix the windows and window sills in the rectory, once we have more money from the Capital Campaign.

The rest of the meeting was devoted to an update by Jean Reed regarding the Trinity Chapel Restoration Campaign.

- Jean and Meredith had had a good discussion about the website and AFM (Asking for money) material. Meredith also was composing a sample thank- you letter with proper 501 (c) (3) verbage to be included in the eventual thank- you letters that Nancy Shepherd and Linda Hammill will be writing to the campaign donors.
- -Donna King will be keeping track of the money donated in the Campaign and Nancy Sawyer will be doing Research.

April 11th will be the Campaign Kick-off. April 18th at the 10-11 time before the beginning of the outdoor church service, there will be an opportunity to discuss the campaign amongst the congregants.

Our next meeting was scheduled for 9 am on Friday, April 16th. (Note--- The meeting date has now been changed to Friday, April 23rd as Stephanie and Chet will not be available on April 16th)
